Contextualización

This course offers an introduction to the syntax of English, paying special attention to the combination of words into major units. Through the exploration and analysis of linguistic data, the course aims to improve the students' knowledge of English grammatical structures and promote reflection upon language. In essence, it is intended to encourage their critical abilities with regard to linguistic phenomena.

Initially, the course will concentrate upon the different types of phrases in contemporary English, their features and structure and their combination into simple clauses. Then, students will be introduced to more complex structures, as is the case of finite and non-finite subordination, as well as coordination. Special attention will be paid to the syntactic analysis of the previous units and its representation through tree diagrams.

Requisitos

Recomendables

* Although this course has no official requirements, students are recommended to have an advanced level of English proficiency (C1), as described by the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages, since the readings, the lectures and the vehicular language within the classroom will be English. Students with a lower level may still enroll in this course, but they must be aware that their performance may be penalized if their use of English is not adequate.



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* It is also recommended that students have completed the following courses: "Introduction to English Linguistics", "English Lexicology" and "Understanding English Grammar I".

Metodología docente

There will be two kinds of contact between the students and the teacher: (1) theory classes and (2) practical sessions. In the latter students will practise the points discussed in the theory classes and occasionally discuss short readings or new topics. These are designed to observe students' progress as well as to propose either reinforcement or a fuller treatment of class topics should students want to pursue them more in depth. In



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any case, due to the intrinsic nature of the course, theory classes will include practice and seminars will also contain some theory-building.

Important notes:

Mobile phones and other **electronic devices** are NOT allowed in the classroom. **Laptop computers** are acceptable ONLY if used for purposes related to classroom activity. No electronic device whatsoever (including computers) is allowed in the classroom during exams/practical sessions, unless otherwise specified by the lecturer (e.g., if the practical session entails use of the internet for pedagogical purposes).

Evaluación del aprendizaje del estudiante

All (UIB and exchange) students will complete the following tasks:

- 1 Mid-term exam: Should students fail this exam, they may re-take it in the official date stipulated by the UIB.
 - 2 Exam at the end of the semester: Should students fail this exam, they may re-take it in the official date stipulated by the UIB.
- **The **minimum mark** required for a part to be computed is 5 (mid-term exam and exam at the end of the semester). In those cases where the mathematical average is higher than 5 but one of the exams has been failed, the student will have 4.5 in his or her marks record.**

Important notes:

- * If a student fails to hand in an assignment or to show up on the day and at the scheduled time by the lecturer, the grade will be 0 (zero). Only if the student has presented 30% or less of the total evaluation tasks, will the grade be 'NP'.
- * Failure to take an official exam will result in a 'NP' grade.
- * The dates and times of the official exams will not be altered under any circumstances, except those contemplated by the Reglament Acadèmic. This applies to ALL students, especially to those involved in any exchange program (both incoming and outgoing students).
- * Students will not be allowed into the classroom when the exam/practical session has already started.
- * Serious lexico-grammatical mistakes will automatically result in a fail grade.

Part-time students:

Students officially recognised by the UIB as part-time students will follow Pathway B. In this case, students are not expected to regularly attend or actively participate in sessions. Those interested in this assessment option will need to present the lecturer with a formal application in the first two weeks of the term, which will include documentary evidence proving that they find themselves in one of the situations contemplated in the Reglament Acadèmic (Article 7).

The Vice-Dean for English Studies will consider all applications and decide whether applicants should be granted part-time student status. Upon notification, Pathway B students will be asked to sign a learning agreement (available from Campus Extens).
