Contextualisation

The aim of this course is to study the relevance of macroeconomics in the socio-political environment and in the tourism sector. This subject provides a discussion of selected topics in macroeconomics. To that end, several models and theories are presented with the goal that student sacquire a set of concepts and skills of Economic Theory such as terminology, methodology, principles and theories. At the end of the course, the students are expected to be able to explain, distinguish, assess and make proposals on the different topics covered in the module.

The main objective of this course is that students understand the main macroeconomic aggregates and analyse the effect of different economic policies on these variables. Furthermore, the course covers the basic concepts and tools needed to undertake the macroeconomic analysis of specific situations and new problems.

Requirements

Recommendable

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There are no compulsory prerequisites.Nevertheless, it is strongly recommended to have a basic knowledge of mathematical optimization and the macroeconomic concepts developed in "Entorno Económico". Furthermore, students are expected to do some basic quantitative exercises in Microsoft Excel.

At the beginning of the semester a schedule of the subject will be made available to students through the UIBdigital platform. The schedule shall at least include the dates when the continuing assessment tests will be conducted and the hand-in dates for the assignments. In addition, the lecturer shall inform students as to whether the subject work plan will be carried out through the schedule or through another way included in the Campus Extens platform.

Student learning assessment

The present subject envisages a continuous assessment. The final exam in Junerepresents 50% of the final grade, and it covers all the content (theoretical and practical) of the subject. The other 50% will be distributed within two partial exams and a work in group. The minimum score required on the final exam in order to consider the evaluations conducted during the semester will be 3.5 points. During the semester, the teacher could propose compulsory activities to pass the subject even though the students could not get any assessment for those activities.

There are two possible itineraries for this course. The itinerary A followed by the ordinary students, and itinerary B **only for the students in CATT group**(Curso adaptado a la temporada turística). Both itineraries imply that students need to take the final exam and this exam computes a 50% of the final grade. The continuous assessment compute the remained 50% in both itineraries. However, CATT students do not have to present the work in group but are requiered to take the two on-site exams (the long-response exam and the multiple choice test) that will compute a 25% of the final grade, each.

Whenever a student does not take a partial exam, their grade for this particular exam will be equal to 0. In the exceptional case of personal judgment, death of a first grade relative or personal hospitalization and being these circumstances properly demonstrated, the percentage of assessment corresponding to the mentionedpartial exam will be transferred to the final exam.

Whenever a student does not pass the subject in June, the student will have the chance to take another exam in September that will represent up to 65% of the final grade (75% for the itinerary B). This 65% (75%) consists in recovering the final exam and in recovering the long-response exam, only in case of being failed during the semester.

As a general rule, the student will only obtain the final grade of 'Not presented' when the student had handed less than one third of the activities subject to assessment.
